## Awards

### **Youth Jackpot Market Goat Show:**

All entry fees for market does will be combined to form a **jackpot** that will be distributed back to winning entries with the Grand Champion Market Doe receiving 60% of the jackpot and the Reserve Champion Market Doe receiving 40%.

Likewise, all entry fees for market wethers will be combined to form a second jackpot that will be distributed back to winning entries with the Grand Champion Market Wether receiving 60% of the jackpot and the Reserve Champion Market Wether receiving 40%.

The Grand Champion Market Doe and Grand Champion Market Wether will each be awarded a **\$100 cash premium** sponsored by Brad & Chase Mackey of B-Mack Farms, LLC in Kinston, NC.

We will also present **cash awards** to the highest-placing exhibitors who are member affiliates of goat-related organizations as indicated below:

#### *Sponsored by Foothills Goat & Sheep Producers Association*

- \$50 to highest placing market wether shown by FG&SPA member
- \$50 to highest placing market doe shown by FG&SPA member

### **Open ABGA-Sanctioned Boer Goat Show:**

Exhibitors will receive ABGA ribbons and show points as specified by the American Boer Goat Association.

## Youth Jackpot Market Goat Show Guidelines

### **Rules & Regulations:**

1. The show is open to youth ages 19 and younger as of show date.
2. Each exhibitor is limited to two (2) entries in the market doe division and two (2) entries in the market wether division.
3. Entry fee is \$10 per entry. There is no pen fee for youth. Number of pens allocated to youth will be determined by show personnel.
4. There are no weight restrictions, but all does and wethers must retain their baby teeth (entries will be mouthed at check-in).
5. Registered and non-registered does are eligible to compete.
6. Wethers must be fully castrated (testicles absent) and completely healed.
7. In order to qualify for **cash awards**, exhibitors must indicate on the Youth Jackpot Entry Form which organizations they/their families are members of.
8. There is no fitting and showmanship contest, but all animals must be clean and in show condition. Exhibitors are expected to maintain control of their animals at all time while in the show ring.
9. Does and wethers will be weighed on Saturday morning prior to the show and assigned to weight classes. Should an exhibitor have two animals that fall into the same weight class, they may select a stand-in youth to represent them in the show ring with permission from show officials.

## ABGA-Sanctioned Boer Goat Show Guidelines

**Entries & Fees:** The Show is open to all exhibitors. There is no limit on the number of animals that can be entered in a class. Entry fee is \$20 per animal if received by **Wednesday, July 7, 2010**. Late entries & substitutions are \$25 per animal.

There is no pen fee for paid FG&SPA members. Non-members pay a \$5 per pen fee. There will be no tack pens available, and exhibitors must put 2 or more goats in each pen except for bucks, which can be penned individually.

### **Sanctioned Show Rules**

**Eligibility of Animals:** All goats must be registered in the herdbook of a recognized association before time specified by the show. Recognized associations include ABGA, International Boer Goat Association, USBGA and the Canadian Boer Goat Association. Original registration certificates are required, though a copy of a Registration Application, stamped with the date received by one of the listed associations, can be accepted for kids less than 3 months of age. Animals must be registered in the name of the exhibitor and must have been owned by the exhibitor on or before date determined by said show. Throughout the ABGA and JABGA Show rules the term exhibitor is defined as the owner of the animal listed in the ABGA registry shown on entry deadline. **All goats must be appropriately identified and comply with USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Guidelines. **Ennobled Herd Book Points:** Only goats entered under their ABGA registration number and presenting their ABGA Certificate of Registration will be eligible to earn points for their actual placing in the show as described in the ABGA "Criteria for Ennoblement of a Boer Goat."

**Tatoos:** All goats must have legible tattoos or other means of permanent identification consistent with its registration certificate or the animal will be disqualified. Point winners from each class must have their tattoos read and recorded. The judge will be responsible for ensuring that the tattoos are read and properly recorded. The show secretary will be responsible for recording the tattoos and informing the judge as to which goats will need to be checked. If the animal has a

microchip as its permanent identification, the exhibitor is responsible for providing a microchip reader.

**Computing Ages:** Birth dates, as listed on the registration certificate, will be used to determine the class divisions. In order to calculate class breaks, take the show date and count back to the birth date to determine the age and the class for the animal.

**Classes:** All animals must be registered purebred, fullblood or percentage blood Boer goats. Divisions are according to the chart below. Bucks 96.86% and lower are not eligible to be shown. Progeny of fresh does will NOT be allowed in the ring. At the discretion of the judge and the superintendent, goats may be let loose in the ring as a function of judging. The Champion and Reserve Champion classes will be chosen from the first and second place animals in that division of the show.
